For over 70 years, the Flight Attendants of AFA have built a career as aviation's first responders. AFA advocacy has achieved important contractual, legal, legislative, and regulatory improvements, including:

- Elimination of Height, Age and Gender Restrictions
- Women's Right to Lead Flight Attendant Positions
- Seniority Merger Protections
- Domestic Partner Benefits and Equal Pay
- Duty Day and Crew Rest Protections
- Minimum Staffing on Aircraft
- Improved Cabin Safety, Including Floor-Level Exits and Less Flammability of Aircraft Cabin
- Whistleblower Protection
- Equal Access to Family and Medical Leave
- Flight Attendant Drug and Alcohol Program (FADAP)
- Defined OSHA Standards in the Cabin
- Known Crewmember (KCM) for Flight Attendants
- No Knives on Planes
- Training for Recognition and Reporting of Human Trafficking
